After a Death Checklist



In British Columbia, when someone dies and you need to look after their affairs, you will make decisions about what to do next. This checklist helps you determine who to notify and keeps you organized.

Keep Track

The checklist can be used on its own or with the website. It's also a good idea to have a journal or create a file folder on your computer to keep track of key information.

Each death is different. Handling the affairs of someone who died is also always different.

Not everything on the checklist will apply to you, but it will point you in the right direction.

General Guidance

- If the death was expected, talk to the medical professionals
- If the death was unexpected,
 - Contact emergency services (Call 9-1-1)
 - Or the BC Coroners Service
- You may need to make arrangements to move the body
 - If you don't use a funeral home, contact Service BC
- Register the death and get the death certificate(s)
- Let important people know, this could include family or friends
- Find the will and estate information, and determine the executor or administrator
 - A will lets you know what to do with a person's estate
 - An executor or administrator carries out the instructions of the will
 - If there is no will, you may need to seek legal counsel or contact the courts
- Decide if you want to use a funeral home
- Plan a funeral or memorial
- Get financial or emotional support
 - You can contact Service BC for a list of resources at 1-800-663-7867
- Cancel services and accounts for the person who died
